PUBLIC FORUM SESSION

<u>Lack of Council support for a motion to the NSW Local Government Conference regarding a refugee</u> settlement program in regional NSW

Ms Gigi Barbe referred to the first meeting of the newly elected Council and was disappointed that Council did not support her request for a motion to the Local Government Conference regarding support for a refugee settlement program for regional NSW (not just specifically Broken Hill) but to increase the economy and population of cities in regional NSW; although she is pleased to see that there is a proposed motion in this meeting's business paper regarding the housing affordability crisis, and would like to see a case put forward to regional government to seek the Australian government's partnership in resourcing the intake of humanitarian visa holders. Mining activity is on the rise in our region but will we have the workforce for the mining industry and in local businesses when the mines begin operations? Ms Barbe urged Council to be visionary and plan for the future.

Ms Barbe referred to the Mayor's comments at the previous Council Meeting that the Council needs more time to consider the motion and more time is needed to consult with the community as to whether they support a motion for a refugee settlement program for regional NSW; and hopes that we will soon have transparent community consultation regarding growing the City's economy and population through the intake of refugees into the City.

<u>Waste Management Conference – Coffs Harbour</u>

Ms Barbe referred to the cost to send delegates to the Waste Management Conference in Coffs Harbour and urged Council to consider only sending one delegate to the conference and registering other delegates to attend the conference via audio-visual link at a reduced cost.

Business Rates

Mr Nick Bobos requested that Council reviews land rates in the City and the possibility of expanding the Broken Hill Local Government boundary to include businesses that have purchased land just outside the boundary to avoid paying rates to Council and yet they use the City's resources to operate their business. Mr Bobos also suggested that vacant land should be rated differently and attract less rates than developed land.

Debt Collection Process

Mr Bobos referred to Council's use of an external debt collection agency located in Sydney and the impact that this has on residents who are required to travel to Sydney to pursue a statement of claim regarding debt collection and requested that Council ceases using this firm and instead engages a local law firm for debt recovery.

Gateway Signage

Mr Bobos spoke in favour of replacing the gateway signs with new signs.

Willa Willyong Creek and the lowering of the Imperial Lake Dam Wall

Ms Lorraine Robertson referred to works being carried out by Essential Water to lower the dam wall at Imperial Lake and the impact of larger flows of water along Willa Willyong Creek once the works to lower the dam wall is complete. Ms Robertson asked whether there was any updates yet to investigations that Council is currently undertaking to mitigate flooding to properties, and that the Department of Land and Water have not been responding to State Member Roy Butler's enquiries made on her behalf.

The General Manager advised that Council has not yet received any responses to its enquiries with authorities, but will enquire again to seek a response and Council will work with Essential Water and the Department of Land and Water to get an outcome.

The Mayor also advised that Council should hopefully have success in receiving a response from the Department of Land and Water as Council is the local statutory authority.

Ms Robinson replied to a question from the Mayor, confirming that herself and other property owners on the Barrier Highway with affected properties along Willa Willyong Creek were not consulted by Essential Water regarding the lowering of the Imperial Lake Dam Wall and what affect this may have on their properties. Ms Robinson also referred to a site visit undertaken by Council staff to understanding the issues and that the creek is also affected by flood water that flows from South Broken Hill.

The Mayor advised Ms Robertson that she will be kept up-to-date with the progress of Council's investigations into the matter.
