Dear Mayor

Thank you for writing on behalf of the residents of Broken Hill about the quality of the drinking water.

I acknowledge the concerns raised and appreciate your advocacy on this matter.

Mr Brad Astill, Chief Executive, Far West Local Health District, has advised that the District's Public Health Unit works closely with Essential Water, alongside the Department of Planning and Environment – Water (DPE Water), to ensure drinking water supplied to Broken Hill and Menindee is safe to consume. As a requirement of the *Public Health Act 2010*, Essential Water has developed a drinking water management system (DWMS) that sets out all the activities it carries out to comply with the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

I am advised that the DWMS sets out the criteria that must be met for water passing through critical control points. Essential Water's critical control points are set to protect the health of the community. Essential Water monitors its critical control points continuously, maintains close communication with NSW Health and DPE Water about any change from normal operations, and responds according to established protocols.

Mr Astill has further advised that routine monitoring of drinking water in Broken Hill during the discolouration event did not identify any departure from the health standards. NSW Health is satisfied that Broken Hill's drinking water remained safe during this event. NSW Health would work with Essential Water and DPE Water to ensure timely and appropriate communication to the public if there was evidence of a health risk.

I understand that the discolouration of the water was due to dissolved manganese coming out of solution after the water was disinfected with chlorine following recent floods. While unpleasant, this is not dangerous. The Australian Drinking Water Guidelines encourage open communication between water utilities and the community. NSW Health will ask Essential Water to conduct a debrief of the discoloured water incident to identify lessons to better respond to, or prevent, future public confusion.

Recommendation

- 2. That Council enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with GARRA Arts Inc permitting exhibitions in 2024, 2026 and 2028.
- 3. That Council resolve the term of the Memorandum of Understanding with GAARA Arts to remain in effect until 31 December 2028.

Executive Summary:

GAARA Arts Inc has a lengthy history in Broken Hill supported by the foresight of the Art Gallery Director of the day, Jacquie Hemsley recognizing and supporting the commitment of the Gallery to promoting the practice of women artists based in the Far West of the State.

The attachment from the group, 'Who or What is GAARA ARTS?' outlines the exhibitions held within several Council facilities, including the Gallery since 2004 through to 2022.

GAARA Arts Inc. has had an informal agreement with Broken Hill City Council to hold an exhibition in the Broken Hill City Art Gallery every two years, with participation in the next Exhibition in 2024 and now seeks formalization of the arrangement within an MOU.

Report:

Council received written correspondence from the President of GAARA Arts Inc., Ms Maureen Clark in August 2022, requesting a formal agreement by way of a Memorandum of Understanding confirming an exhibition in 2024 and for the provision of an exhibition every two years in the Broken Hill City Art Gallery.

Council resolved at its Ordinary Meeting held 21 December 2022:

That the General Manager in consultation with the Art Gallery Advisory Committee, drafts a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for discussion with Gaara Arts Inc., and provides a report back to Council for feedback on entering an MOU.

That the general terms and conditions of the MOU will include current general arrangements which are; that the gallery staff resource and install the artworks in appropriate gallery space; promote the exhibition through standard channels; that the Artist Gallery Agreement is signed and that the term of the MOU conclude December 2027 for further negotiation (permitting exhibitions in 2024 and 2026).

Council forwarded correspondence, attaching the draft MOU to the President of GAARA Arts Inc, Ms Maureen Clark for consideration on 19 January 2023 seeking discussion to progress the MOU.

Consultation of the draft MOU informed the following changes to the document:

- Amendment "The first exhibition under this agreement to be held in 2024."
 (Updated to align with the next exhibition, scheduled for 2024)
- Insert "That the GAARA Arts Inc. exhibition timing in the Art Gallery be closely aligned with the acknowledgement of women's issues nationally and internationally."
- Amendment "This MOU will remain in effect until 31 December 2028."
 (Extension of 12 months to allow for three exhibitions to be carried out during the term of MOU).

Following final consultation and engagement GAARA Arts Inc President, Ms Maureen Clark returned a signed copy of the draft MOU to Council for its consideration. The returned draft MOU signed by GAARA Arts Inc is attached.

DRAFT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - GAARA ARTS INC. AND BROKEN HILL CITY COUNCIL

SCOPE

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets out the terms and understanding between GAARA Arts Inc. and the Broken Hill City Council, to grant GAARA Arts Inc. the ability to conduct biennial art exhibitions at the Broken Hill City Art Gallery. The first exhibition under this agreement to be held in 2024.

That the GAARA Arts Inc. exhibition timing in the Art Gallery be closely aligned with the acknowledgement of women's issues nationally and internationally.

2. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this MOU is to formalise this agreement and give clarity and certainty to the members of the GAARA Arts Inc. and guarantee Broken Hill City Council a continuation of exhibition event.

This MOU aims to encourage and support an ongoing and positive relationship between the GAARA Arts Inc. and Broken Hill City Council (Council), to ensure the group of artists work is celebrated in the local community.

3. PARTNER ORGANISATIONS

This MOU is made between:

- The Broken Hill City Council (BHCC)
- and
- GAARA Arts Inc.

4. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

This MOU does not call for a commitment of funding from the Broken Hill City Council but does seek for a commitment of appropriate gallery space and gallery staff resource to install the artworks. The Broken Hill City Art Gallery would also be expected to promote the exhibition through standard channels.

This MOU may be modified by mutual consent of the authorised officers from GAARA Arts Inc. and Broken Hill City Council. This MOU shall become effective upon signature by the authorised officials from GAARA Arts Inc. and Broken Hill City Council.

This MOU will remain in effect until 31 December 2028.
